John Howard Society Core Values

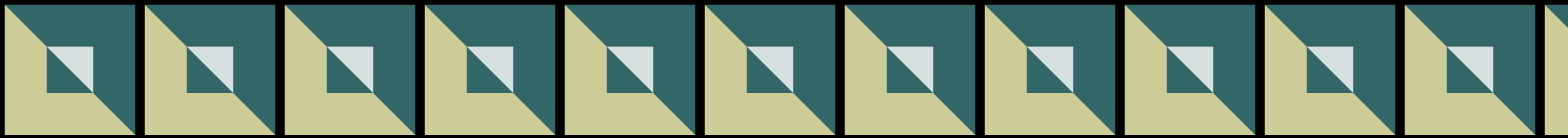
- People have the right to live in a safe and peaceful society as well as a responsibility to respect the law.

Fairview



Fairview is a **NON-SMOKING** four-plex with six (6) bedrooms to accommodate women.

There are security cameras at all entrances and exits. In order to gain access to the house each resident will have an individual key fob.

Outreach staff are available Sunday to Thursday from 7:30am to 11:00pm, Friday and Saturday from 7:30am to 1:00am.

Accommodations and Facilities

- 2 one bedroom suites and 2 two bedroom suites
- Can accommodate women with children
- Each bedroom has its own locking door
- Free laundry facility
- Close to bus stop
- Shared common area and kitchen in the two bedroom suites
- Fully landscaped front and back yard
- Gazebo in back yard

Community Reintegration Program

- Residents who come to the Fairview house are assisted in making changes that help them reintegrate into the community.
- Establishing a balanced lifestyle
 - Developing healthy relationships
 - Resolving issues relating to addictions
 - Assistance in obtaining identification and BC medical card
 - Preparing your own meals, if needed
 - Budgeting
 - Searching for employment
 - Upgrading your education
 - Cleaning up after oneself
 - Making appointments
 - Developing support
 - Becoming independent
 - Addressing physical health and mental health concerns
 - Developing healthy coping strategies

Regulations

- Rules and Regulations are a part of any conditional release. While the Fairview house has a set of rules that pertain to all tenants, each CSC tenant will have their own parole conditions that will assist with reintegrating into the community.
- Residents shall comply at all times with their conditions of release.
- Residents must comply with curfews, if applicable.
- Residents are allowed to bring 3 boxes maximum of personal possessions.
- Residents are expected to use their daily time in a meaningful way. This includes programming, employment, training, educational and/or vocational upgrading, volunteering and support groups.
- No alcohol or drugs on the premises.
- Smoking in designated area ONLY.
- Residents must respect all ethnicities, cultures, religions, genders and sexual orientation.
